

#### Dear Colleague:

It is a pleasure to send you IUE NASA Newsletter #19. This issue contains, in microfiche form and attached to the inside rear cover, the four-year cumulative merged log of IUE observations for the period ending March 31, 1982. Excepting solar system targets arranged at the end, the log is ordered by right ascension for all observations whether obtained at Goddard or VILSPA. This Newsletter also updates the procedures for obtaining IUE data from the National Space Science Data Center, publishes an IUE target bibliography citing references to IUE data which have been published in the scientific literature, and contains several other contributions of interest to the IUE user community. Your attention is especially called to an important announcement on page 2 of this issue.

Included in the pocket containing the microfiche edition of the IUE merged log is an IUE Newsletter recipient response card. Those of us with the IUE Project ask you to help us update our address list and/or modify our mailing to you. The Newsletter now goes to more than 600 individuals and institutions. Your reply will help us to better serve you and effectively manage our resources.
